Flying Boats: Sydney's golden age of aviation

- Exhibition at Museum of Sydney from May 10 to September 14, 2008

1938 saw the dawn of a golden age of aviation when Rose Bay became home to Sydney's first international airport, servicing the mighty flying boats – large, luxurious, four-engine aircraft that alighted on water. This was the beginning of an era when air travel was new, exciting and glamorous.

Featuring photographs, posters, film, a recreated cabin, and the fascinating personal stories of travellers *Flying boats* celebrates the early days of transoceanic air travel and presents a definitive account of this extraordinary chapter in Sydney's history. Sunday 11 May - Matthew Holle

Join curator Matthew Holle for a floor talk on the exhibition [Flying Boats](#). Matthew will share his inspiration for the exhibition and the personal involvement of his family in the Flying Boats story. The talk will discuss some of the stories behind the images and objects in the exhibition.

Sunday 18 May - Margaret Holle

Margaret Holle (nee Bellingham) was an air hostess on Ansett flying boats from 1956 until 1962. During those years she made over 300 flights from Rose Bay to Lord Howe Island and retired when she married Noel Holle who was an engineer at the base.

Sunday 15 June - Genevieve Kirton

Genevieve is the daughter of P G Taylor an expert navigator who completed the first

crossing by air of the Southern Pacific from Rose Bay to Chile via Tahiti and Easter Island. Genevieve will share her recollections of her father's history with flying Catalinas.

Sunday 22 June - Warwick Biggsworth

Exhibition floor talk with Warwick Biggsworth, President of the Aviation Historical Society (NSW Branch). Warwick will be speaking about the history of flying boats in Sydney harbour.

Sunday 29 June - Ian Debenham

Exhibition floor talk with Ian Debenham, Curator of Transport, Powerhouse Museum.
